# Classical Actors Ensemble returns to parks this summer with All's Well That Ends Well

## Free, Family-Friendly Performances June 13 - July 13

(Minneapolis, MN)—Classical Actors Ensemble (CAE) announces an 11th season of Shakespeare in Our Parks with a new production of *All's Well That Ends Well*. Directed by Producing Artistic Director Joseph Papke, this comedy will be performed in parks across the Twin Cities, June 13 – July 13, 2025, including partnership performances with Franconia Sculpture Park and the MN Humanities Center.

"All's Well That Ends Well has long intrigued scholars with its fairy tale structure and seemingly immature characters," said Joseph Papke. "Our production will explore the universal humanity behind the characters' actions, while embracing the ridiculous lengths to which love can drive us."

Written circa 1605-6, *All's Well* is a dark comedy and one of Shakespeare's less-commonly performed plays. The plot centers on Helena, a young commoner who loves the high born Count Bertram. When he leaves home to join the army, she takes matters into her own hands, following him to Paris and shaping events around her to create her own happy ending. CAE last staged *All's Well* in 2011, at the old Walker Church in south Minneapolis.

CAE honors Shakespeare's work by making high-quality entertainment available for all at no charge through its annual Shakespeare in Our Parks program. CAE encourages audiences to bring a picnic to enjoy this free outdoor entertainment for the entire family. In keeping with CAE's aesthetic, this production will include live, modern music performed by the cast.

Previous Shakespeare in Our Parks productions: *Twelfth Night (2024), Much Ado About Nothing* (2023), *Love's Labors Lost* (2022, 2014), *A Midsummer Night's Dream* (2021, 2016), *The Merry Wives of Windsor* (2019), *Romeo & Juliet* (2018), *The Comedy of Errors* (2017), and *The Two Gentlemen of Verona* (2015).

#### THE ARTISTS

The cast features several current or graduating U of M/Guthrie BFA students: Catherine Podlesak stars as Helena, Henry Zavos as Bertram, as well as George Kleven, Isaac Leer, Shannon O'Sullivan, Maya Pantanowitz, and Nate Turcotte. In addition, Tinne Rosenmeier plays the Countess, John Goodrich, the King, newcomer Tom Burr is featured as Parolles, and CAE stalwart Alan Tilson plays Lafew. Completing the cast are J. Emily Peabody and Jeremy Williams.

Scenic design is by Justin Hooper and costumes by Molly Smith. The production is directed by Joseph Papke.
